



Wisbech and Villages Say NO! to the Incinerator

- It will emit toxins and other particulate poisons that will pollute and contaminate air, soil, and water. The residue and ashes will also be contaminated and go to landfill
- It is being built on land at highest risk of flooding (Zone 3). It
 poses a real threat to water courses, groundwater and the
 environment
- We have 9 schools, 3 of which will be very close to this Incinerator, which would be one of the very largest in Europe
- We are an historic market town with over 260 Listed buildings and a growing population of 35,000 plus the nearby villages
- This mega Incinerator will further endanger our migratory wildfowl on The Wash and Welney Wetlands
- Every year it will release over 650,000 tonnes of carbon dioxide into the atmosphere. Carbon dioxide is a major cause of global warming. It makes a mockery of the UK's attempts to reduce carbon emissions

Topics that people living near and downwind of the exhaust plumes and fallout from the proposed incinerator should be concerned about...

- Traffic congestion: With no railway station or access to a dual carriageway, the A47, Cromwell Road, Weasenham Lane, Elm High Road are already congested roads. 300 heavy lorry movements every day, 24 hours a day will choke Wisbech making it an extremely unpleasant town to visit
- Health fears: Stress, anxiety, sleep deprivation, untested long term implications related to childbirth abnormalities
- Contamination: Lorries will bring mixed waste from all over the UK which can be stored for up to 11 days. Imagine the mixed smell of exhaust and decaying material! The bottom ash residue has toxic content such as heavy metals which are untreatable in this country and have to be sent and dumped abroad.
- Noise and Light Pollution: It will be lit up all night to alert aircraft and because of the 24 hour plant operation and continuous dumper truck activities. Artificial light affects human and environmental health
- Environmental impact: this proposed blot on our historic Georgian landscape would be built near several schools, in the path of prevailing winds that will guide any contaminate towards A1 farmland, natural watercourses and all over the Fens.
